




New species: *Australopristis wiffeni*

Abstract: A single crown of sawfish rostral 'tooth' with at least two barbs along its posterior margin is comparable with *Onchopristis dunklei* from the Woodbine Formation of Texas and *Atlanticopristis equatorialis* from the Alcântara Formation of Brazil. However, it is regarded here as an aberrant *O. numidus*, the typical form from North Africa. An aberrant morph of *Onchopristis numidus* is considered pathological. The taxonomic utility of barb number in pristid rostral 'teeth' is discussed. The genus and species *Australopristis wiffeni* gen. et sp. nov. is erected to accommodate some multi-cusped rostral teeth from the Late Cretaceous of New Zealand.

New species: *Rhomaleodus budurovi*

Abstract: This study identifies three new neoselachian tooth taxa from the Middle and Upper Triassic. On the basis of morphological and histological characters, *Rhomaleodus budurovi*, nov. gen. et sp. (Anisian of Bulgaria), is resolved as stem selachimorph, with an additional specimen from the same stratigraphic level assigned to *Synechodus* sp. Selachimorph grade of enameloid microstructural organization (crystalline bundles) was also identified during examination of the dental tissues of "Polyacrodus" *holwellensis* (Rhaetian of England), necessitating its transfer to the new genus *Duffinselache*. The present data reveal several levels of increasing architectural complexity in the arrangement of the enameloid crystalline bundles of stem selachimorphs, which are argued to convey a phylogenetic signal that can be used to establish relationships within the group. It is suggested that the evolution of the hypermineralized enameloid cover of neoselachian teeth progressed from a plesiomorphic single crystalline state, through amalgamation of individual crystals into loosely defined bundles (marking the appearance of Selachimorpha), and their subsequent differentiation into a highly ordered parallel bundles, followed by the development of an inner layer of haphazardly oriented bundles. The superficial shiny-layered enameloid of Neoselachii is interpreted as remnant of a much reduced single crystalline layer.

New species: *Tantalepis gatehousei*

Abstract: Microvertebrate sampling of the Stairway Sandstone (Darrivilian, Middle Ordovician, central Australia) has yielded scales that are chondrichthyan-like in their overall construction, and *Tantalepis gatehousei* gen. et sp. nov. is erected here to describe these specimens. *Tantalepis gatehousei* gen. et sp. nov. is the stratigraphically oldest microsquamous taxon described thus far, and the 'shark-like' appearance of the scales may extend the chondrichthyan lineage back into the Middle Ordovician. The presence of 'shark-like' scales in the fossil record some 50 myr prior to the first articulated chondrichthyan body fossils and 44 myr before the first clearly identifiable chondrichthyan teeth suggests there is a considerable scope for the recovery of articulated specimens with which to document the early history of crown gnathostomes. Traditional hypotheses of phylogenetic relationships among early jawed vertebrates were recently challenged by the proposal of a radically different tree topology. However, the development of a new data set specifically addressing scale-based characters is required before taxa such as *Tantalepis*, that are based upon disarticulated remains alone, can be firmly placed within the emerging, revised, evolutionary narrative.

New species: *Parasquatina justinensis*, *Parasquatina jarvisi*

Abstract: Bulk sampling of phosphate-rich horizons within the Late Cretaceous of the Anglo-Paris Basin yielded numerous teeth of members of the Squatiniformes. Along with isolated tooth remains, two museum specimens comprising partial articulated endoskeletal remains including the holotype of the species *Squatina cranei* Woodward, 1888a are described, and a new subgenus *Cretascyllium* is proposed for species of the genus *Squatina* with high degree of heterodonty and triangular anterior teeth. The species *Squatina* (*Cretascyllium*) *cranei* comb. nov. and *Squatina* (*Cretascyllium*) *hassei* comb. nov. are referred to this subgenus. The genus *Parasquatina* Herman, 1982 previously erected on a single tooth is valid, and two new species *P. justinensis* sp. nov. and *P. jarvisi* sp. nov. are described along with a third taxon *Parasquatina* sp. An enigmatic tooth referred to ?*Neoselachii incertae sedis* is also reported. The palaeoecology of these taxa is discussed.

New species: *Abdounia vassilyevae*, *Abdounia lata*

Abstract: Two new species of carcharhinid sharks from the Late Eocene deposits (Tavda Formation) of the southern Trans[1]Urals, *Abdounia vassilyevae* sp. nov., previously determined as *A. aff. beaugei*, and *A. lata* sp. nov., are described. To date, up to five Priabonian species of *Abdounia* have been recorded. New finds supplement the data on diversity, evolution, and paleobiogeography of *Abdounia*.

New species: *Argoubia barbei*, *Oromobula dakhlaensis*, *Eoplinthicus underwoodi*

Abstract: The exact affinities of the fossil teeth attributed to the devilrays (mobulids) are critical for resolving the debated origin of these giant pelagic rays amongst Myliobatiformes and the timing of their evolution toward planktivory. We performed the first detailed comparative description of teeth belonging to most of the living and fossil mobulids. Based on a survey of living devilrays, three dental morphologies are newly identified as cobblestone tooth plates, comb-like teeth, and peg-like teeth. In addition, all extinct mobulid species are reviewed with comments on their dentition, fossil record, and geographical distribution. As a result, three fossil mobulid taxa are newly described from the Late Eocene of south-west Morocco (*Argoubia barbei* gen. et sp. nov., *Oromobula dakhlaensis* gen. et sp.

nov., and *Eoplithicus underwoodi* sp. nov.). This has permitted the first assessment of the phylogenetic positions of extinct and extant species of mobulids, using cladistic analyses and a combined data set of nondental anatomical characters from the literature and the dental characters defined here. Our new results support the monophyly of mobulids including all living and most extinct species and indicate that mobulids are closely related to rhinopterids. They also indicate that there was a recent split within Mobulidae into the three tooth morphology groups that we describe in this paper. This work provides clues to the evolutionary history of this clade since the Early Eocene, including the gradual lack in tooth interlocking toward the filter-feeding strategy, whereas the preservation of cusped teeth without feeding function in modern filter-feeder mobulids is interpreted as a tool for precopulatory purposes.

New species: *Cretaplatyrhinoidis ornatus*, *Pseudoplatyrhina crispa*, *Rhinobatos seruensis*, *Squatirhina draytoni*, *Agaleorhynchus britannicus*, *Ptychotrygonoides sabatieri*

Abstract: Bulk sampling of phosphatic horizons from the Late Cretaceous of the Anglo-Paris Basin and Northern Ireland yielded very rich and high diversity selachian faunas. Amongst them, batoid remains (rays and skates) are commonly present and diverse although never a dominant element of these assemblages. The following new taxa are described: *Cretaplatyrhinoidis ornatus* gen. et sp. nov., *Pseudoplatyrhina crispa* gen. et sp. nov., 'Rhinobatos' *seruensis* sp. nov., *Squatirhina draytoni* sp. nov., *Agaleorhynchus britannicus* gen. et sp. nov. and *Ptychotrygonoides sabatieri* sp. nov. Batoids are described for the first time from post-Cenomanian Late Cretaceous deposits of England and the dentition of species of the genus *Squatirhina* is described and discussed. The *Platyrhinidae* described here represent the oldest known records for the family and the Cenomanian material identified as *Dasyatoidea* indet. is one of the rare remains of the order *Myliobatiformes* from pre-Campanian horizons. Evolutionary and palaeoecological observations are also discussed.

New genus: *Kaibabvenator*, *Nanoskalme*, *Neosaivodus*

New species: *Kaibabvenator swiftae*, *Nanoskalme natans*, *Neosaivodus flagstaffensis*

Abstract: A diverse assemblage of chondrichthyans has recently been recognised from the Permian (Late Leonardian) Kaibab Formation in and around Flagstaff, Arizona. Of this diverse assemblage, the ctenacanthiforms constitute seven tooth taxa of which three are new: *Saivodus* sp., *Neosaivodus flagstaffensis* gen. et sp. nov., *Glikmanius occidentalis*, *Glikmanius myachkovensis*, *Heslerodus divergens*, *Kaibabvenator swiftae* gen. et sp. nov. and *Nanoskalme natans* gen. et sp. nov. The range in tooth types suggests predator partitioning within these ctenacanthiforms. *Saivodus* sp., *Neosaivodus flagstaffensis* gen. et sp. nov., *H. divergens*, *G. occidentalis* and *G. myachkovensis* had puncturing and grasping teeth adapted for securing smaller prey to be swallowed whole. *Nanoskalme natans* gen. et sp. nov. had teeth for grasping and cutting, perhaps an adaptation for feeding or scavenging on larger organisms, whereas *K. swiftae* gen. et sp. nov. had large grasping and serrated cutting teeth for feeding on larger prey and was perhaps the apex predator of the Kaibab Sea. A cladistic analysis of the Ctenacanthiformes based on teeth suggests that in contrast to previous interpretations the family Ctenacanthidae may in fact be paraphyletic. We propose that the Ctenacanthiformes had a greater familiar diversity than currently recognised. The Kaibab assemblage is presently the most diverse ctenacanth assemblage for the global marine Permian.

New species: *Isacrodus marthae*, *Texasodus varidentatus*

New genus: *Isacrodus*, *Texasodus*

Abstract: The teeth of two new genera of jalodontid sharks have been found in the strata of the Middle Permian in the Guadalupe Mountains area of West Texas. *Isacrodus marthae* gen. et sp. nov. occurs in the Williams Ranch Member, Cutoff Formation, Roadian. A second taxon *Texasodus varidentatus* gen. et sp. nov. is found in beds of the Hegler and Pinery Members, Bell Canyon Formation, Upper Wordian-Lower Capitanian. The family Jalodontidae includes *Jalodus*, *Adamantina* and the two new genera; *Isacrodus* and *Texasodus*.

New species: *Carcharodon hubbelli*

Abstract: The taxonomic origin of the white shark, *Carcharodon*, is a highly debated subject. New fossil evidence presented in this study suggests that the genus is derived from the broad-toothed 'mako', *Carcharodon* (*Cosmopolitodus*) *hastalis*, and includes the new species *C. hubbelli* sp. nov. – a taxon that demonstrates a transition between *C. hastalis* and *Carcharodon carcharias*. Specimens from the Pisco Formation clearly demonstrate an evolutionary mosaic of characters of both recent *C. carcharias* and fossil *C. hastalis*. Characters diagnostic to *C. carcharias* include the presence tooth serrations and a symmetrical first upper anterior tooth that is the largest in the tooth row, while those indicative of *C. hastalis* include a mesially slanted third anterior (intermediate) tooth. We also provide a recalibration of critical fossil horizons within the Pisco Formation, Peru using zircon U-Pb dating and strontium-ratio isotopic analysis. The recalibration of the absolute dates suggests that *Carcharodon hubbelli* sp. nov. is Late Miocene (6–8 Ma) in age. This research revises and elucidates lamnid shark evolution based on the calibration of the Neogene Pisco Formation.

New genus: *Cromhallia*

New species: *Cromhallia parvunda*

Abstract: Sixteen different Lower Carboniferous (Tournaisian Courcayan to Chadian age, Mississippian) chondrichthyan teeth types have been extracted from Triassic erosional/aeolian fills in shallow karst systems found in the limestone quarry at Cromhall, Gloucestershire, England. These Carboniferous teeth have been found within a much larger assemblage of disarticulated bones and teeth belonging to small late Triassic terrestrial reptiles, for which Cromhall quarry is famous. The Carboniferous teeth are derived fossils, released during subaerial dissolution of the surrounding limestones. Owing to low specimen numbers and uncertainty of intraspecific character, 10 types of teeth are left in open nomenclature, although it is likely they represent new taxa. They belong to *Jalodus*, *Ctenacanthiformes*, *Protacrodus*, *Orodus*, *Chomatodus*, *Petalodontidae*, *Euchondrocephali?*, *Helodus* and *Psephodus*. A new genus and species, *Cromhallia parvunda*, of indeterminate phylogenetic relationships, is also erected. The assemblage includes also an identified suite comprising *Thrinacodus ferox*, *Bransonella* cf. *nebraskensis* and *Stethacanthus* cf. *altonensis*. The identification of all fish teeth found in the Cromhall assemblages as derived fossils from the Carboniferous removes any ambiguity regarding the fully terrestrial nature of the late Triassic fauna preserved in the residue-bearing karst systems.

Abstract: Elasmobranch fossils recovered from Campanian marine exposures at Elizabethtown, Bladen County, NC, include species from at least seven genera of sharks and four genera of batoids. Of particular interest is the recovery of multiple isolated rostral spines from a new sclerorhynchid sawfish, *Borodinopristis shannoni*, sp. nov. Species of *Borodinopristis* are known from oral teeth and/or rostral spines ('rostral teeth' for some authors). In species known from the latter, the spines differ from those of other sclerorhynchids by the presence of one or more 'collared' barbs on the posterior margin of the crown. Unlike the previously described *B. schwimmeri*, the rostral spines of the new species have well-developed hooked barbs with collars (curved, connected crests) extending asymmetrically onto the dorsal and ventral surfaces of the spine, as well as small, rudimentary barbs. Also unlike *B. schwimmeri*, the anterior margin of the spine is strongly convex and there is no enamelled collar at the base of the crown. The new species also occurs in the Upper Cretaceous of the Gulf Coastal Plain.

Abstract: Two new species of the softnose skate genus *Brochiraja* are described based on material collected from the Norfolk Ridge in the northern Tasman Sea (South-West Pacific). Most of this material was collected in 2003 by the New Zealand vessel, RV Tangaroa, during the NORFANZ voyage. These species extend the known range of the genus northward along the Norfolk Ridge, and along with *B. aenigma*, are the only other representatives of the genus found outside seas adjacent New Zealand. *Brochiraja heuresa* sp. nov. is known from the western Norfolk Ridge and the Wanganella Bank at 870- 1350 m depth, whereas *B. vittacauda* sp. nov. is known from a smaller area of the western Norfolk Ridge at 629-973 m depth. These species differ from each other, and from other nominal members of the genus, in morphometrics, meristics, coloration and squamation.

Abstract: A new species of softnose skate (Arhynchobatidae) is described, based on a single adult male measuring 895 mm TL that was collected at a depth of 953-1,022 m on the Coriolis Bank off western New Caledonia in the southwestern Pacific Ocean. The specimen conforms to the genus *Bathyraja* in having the rostral cartilage continuous with the neurocranium and very slender and uncalcified over its length. *Bathyraja leucomelanos* sp. nov. differs from its congeners through a combination of the following characters: distinctive coloration of the disc with white dorsal and black ventral surfaces, dorsal surface of the disc entirely covered with dermal denticles, ventral surface naked, anterior portion of the anterior margin of the disc straight, snout long and very broad with orbit about 6.0 times in preorbital length, orbit 0.73 times interorbital width, mouth 6.8% TL, tail 0.88 times preloacal length, accessory terminal 2 cartilage of the clasper having an expanded disc-shaped tip,

and alar thorn tip undulating. Molecular barcoding from the COI sequence reveals that this new species is genetically close to *B. spinicauda* from the North Atlantic Ocean.

Abstract: We describe *Bythaelurus giddingsi* sp. nov. based on 7 specimens collected using the submersible Johnson Sea-Link from deepwater (428-562 m depth) areas of the Galápagos Islands. It is presumed to be endemic to the archipelago. The new species differs from its congeners in its coloration, the length of its anal-fin base, and in other morphological characters. The disjunct distribution of species of the widely-distributed Indo-Pacific genus *Bythaelurus* is discussed.

Abstract: A new whipray, *Himantura randalli* sp. nov., described from material collected off Bahrain, Kuwait and Qatar, appears to be endemic to the Persian Gulf. It has been frequently confused with forms of the more widely distributed whipray *Himantura gerrardi* Gray and other presently unidentified species from the Indian Ocean. *Himantura randalli* sp. nov. is distinguished from these species by a combination of characters, i.e. disc shape, morphometrics, squamation (including its rapid denticle development and denticle band shape), plain dorsal disc coloration, and whitish saddles on a dark tail in young. It is a medium-sized whipray with a maximum confirmed size of 620 mm disc width (DW) and a birth size of around 150-170 mm DW. Males mature at approximately 400 mm DW. *Himantura randalli* sp. nov. is relatively abundant in the shallow, soft-sedimentary habitats of the Persian Gulf from where it is commonly taken as low-value or discarded bycatch of gillnet and trawl fisheries.

Abstract: Four new skates of the genus *Notoraja* Ishiyama, 1958 are described from the rarely accessed, deep waters off New Caledonia, Vanuatu and Fiji islands, and the Norfolk Ridge. Three of these (*N. alisae* n. sp., *N. longiventralis* n. sp. and *N. fijiensis* n. sp.) are "velcro skates" which are characterised by their velvety dorsal and ventral surfaces, covered with fine denticles. Although similar in shape, they differ by their colour pattern, dermal armature, development of the lateral tail folds, and size of the pelvic-fin anterior lobe and nasal curtain. The description of the fourth species, *Notoraja inusitata* n. sp., is based on a juvenile male exhibiting some unusual features resembling those of other skate genera.

Abstract: Two species of *Myliobatis*, the southern eagle ray *M. goodei* Garman and the bullnose eagle ray *M. freminivillii* Le Sueur, have long been recognized to occur in coastal Argentinean waters. Several unusual specimens belonging to the family Myliobatidae were recently collected off Buenos Aires Province, Argentina. These specimens clearly belong to the genus *Myliobatis*, since they have a broad disk with long sharply pointed pectoral fins, a projecting snout, a very long and thin tail, and a smaller dorsal fin set farther back on the tail, well beyond the pelvic fins. However, the specimens were distinct from all sympatric congeners in several characters, and they are described here as a

new species. *Myliobatis ridens* sp. nov. is distinguished from *M. goodei* in having a relatively shorter snout, a wider interorbital space, a wider mouth, and different shapes of the ventral and dorsal marginal cartilages of the claspers than the latter; and from *M. freminvillii* by having smaller eyes, a smaller dorsal fin, a plain dorsal coloration, and a different shape of the dorsal marginal cartilage of the claspers. In order to test this morphological differentiation, cytochrome c oxidase subunit I (COI) sequence data were obtained from the new species and compared to those of its congeners. Analysis of COI sequences showed a congeneric sequence divergence of > 6%, supporting species differentiation. Therefore combining both traditional taxonomy and DNA barcoding, a new eagle ray species, *M. ridens* sp. nov., from the Southwest Atlantic Ocean was discovered.

As a result, we found that there may be four basic lineages in this order, i.e., *Bathyraja* (Arhynchobatidae), *Amblyraja* (Rajidae), *Dipturus* (Rajidae) and *Rostroraja* (Rajidae). It is also likely that the genus *Amblyraja* forms the subfamily *Amblyrajinae* and the genus *Rostroraja* the subfamily *Rostrorajinae*. A new genus *Beringraja* is established for two species (*B. binoculata* (Guard, 1855) and *B. pilchra* (Liu, 1932)), in which egg capsules contain more than one embryo. We propose that the genus *Fenestraja* should be re-allocated to the family Arhynchobatidae and that *Raja clavata* Linnaeus, 1758 should be included in the genus *Malacoraja*.
